# Management's discussion of fund performance

The fund's Class ABLE-A shares gained 20.91% for the year ended October 31, 2024. That result compares with a 38.02% gain for the S&P 500 Index. #### What factors influenced results


The U.S. economy continued to grow during the fund's fiscal year, and with inflation easing, the U.S. Federal Reserve began instituting interest rate cuts late in the period. Equities posted strong gains, while bond investors enjoyed higher yields for much of the period.

The fund's focus on domestic, dividend-paying equities offered strong overall returns for the fiscal year. Bond returns favored longer durations and high-yield issuers.

Overseas holdings, in both equities and bonds, offered positive returns but nonetheless were lower than the fund's overall return.


