A quality focus

Intermediate Bond Fund of America invests primarily in:

- U.S. government and federal agency securities.
- Bonds rated primarily A-/A3 or better, including corporate, mortgage-backed and asset-backed bonds. The fund also can invest up to 10% in debt rated BBB/Baa.

Intermediate approach

The fund's dollar-weighted average maturity is no less than three years and no greater than five years. Below are the results of the fund's intermediate approach compared with money market funds, which have offered more income. Longer term bond funds have generated lower five-year returns with greater volatility than the fund.

Thorough analysis

Insights from our proprietary Capital Strategy Research group, economists and duration analysts help determine the fund's most appropriate maturity and yield curve position. The fund's U.S. Treasury, corporate, mortgage-backed and asset-backed securities analysts evaluate hundreds of individual securities to find undervalued investments for the fund.



*Unlike long-term bond funds, money market funds are tailored for short-term investments and aim to maintain a stable value, typically resulting in lower returns. In contrast, long-term bonds offer the potential for higher returns over time, but with greater volatility and reduced liquidity.

The fund's five portfolio managers each manage a portion of fund assets independently and have a median 28 years of investment industry experience as of the prospectus dated 11/1/24. A group of investment analysts also manages a portion of the fund.
